**Module one** features a range of activities that help participants to recall childhood experiences and the way they have affected their opinions on how children are cared for now.

**Module two** features a range of activities that are designed to raise awareness about core aspects of child abuse in a cultural and legal context.

**Module three** features a range of activities that help participants to identify and strengthen practices in the family and community that protect children from harm, and offers guidance on where they can find support.

Facilitators can select activities and develop individual sessions or a series of workshops, depending on the needs of the audience.

The CD contains all the resources in English, French, Chinese, Urdu, Bengali and Arabic.
